Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking statement

We are committed to ensuring that no practices of modern slavery or human trafficking take place within AIG Life Limited, whether directly or within our supply chain, and ensuring that we continue to review our practices for consistency with best practice.

ORGANISATION STRUCTURE

AIG Life Limited is a provider of life and protection insurance in the United Kingdom and Crown Territories. We are a part of the wider AIG group ("Group"), and our ultimate parent company is American International Group, Inc. with its head office in New York, the United States of America.

OUR BUSINESS AND SUPPLY CHAINS

Our business serves individual customers. Our products include life insurance, critical illness insurance and income protection.

Our supply chains include third party suppliers of facilities management services including, for example, cleaning, security and stationary; and professional services, such as medical screening services.

OUR POLICIES ON MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. We strive to act in an ethical manner with respect to all of our suppliers and business partners and to endorse the same high standards in their dealings with us.

COMBATING SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND IDENTIFYING ANY RISKS

We continue to conduct internal assessments to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not taking place in any part of our business or supply chains. In terms of the level of risk, because of the nature of our business and our suppliers, we have a lower risk profile than in many other industries. We intend to continue focusing on our supply chains going forward through our periodical audits of such suppliers. Any risks identified from these audits will also be recorded and escalated if needs be. We intend to maintain records of, and monitor, any risks identified.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we carry out ongoing monitoring of the third party suppliers we use.

We have in place systems to:

- (a) identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- (b) mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.
- (c) monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- (d) protect whistle blowers.

SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES

We have in place various internal vendor and supplier policies which are designed to ensure all those in our supply chain and all contractors we engage comply with our values and to minimise the risk of slavery and human trafficking.

FURTHER STEPS

Following a review of the effectiveness of the steps we have taken to mitigate the risk of modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains we intend to take the following further steps going forward:

- sharing this statement with all of our staff members and including it within our joining materials for our new employees;
- further examining our supply chains to identify any risk areas; and
- on the next formal update of our internal whistle-blower policy, we will incorporate specific provisions linking to the Act.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 31 December 2016.
